




## GLASS

More often than not, I use glass to create chic spaces. Such spaces keep up with the latest fads and fashions to provide the hotel with Instagram-worthy photo opportunities. Citing another example, in the hotel Devi Ratn in Jaipur, we aimed









to create a resplendent and opulent living space, keeping up with the prestigious Taj Hotel Group. Glass has been used sparsely yet impactfully, creating a bold impression on the entrance itself. At the foyer of this captivating property, we have constructed a porch that is accompanied by a glimmering ceiling design along with apt lighting systems. We have built the concept of the entire hotel in a way that exemplifies the cultural beauty and heritage of Jaipur. The reception pods were designed so that the existing Haveli Darwaza with mirror embroidery would be the backdrop, reflecting Rajasthani culture. The area titled 'Mandala' has a mirrored ceiling that illustrates the detailed facets of the room, again contributing to the rich culture of the state.

It is also widely available in a variety of colors, designs, and patterns, making it a very flexible and easy-to-use material.
